

CTE's 21st Century Teaching Demos SPRING 2019

Do you have a favorite class activity or teaching technique that works with your class every time? Is one of your assessments or review strategies especially fun to implement? Do you leave class after certain sessions or topics feeling particularly successful in engaging and stimulating your students? Have you recently tried something new or innovative in your class that you want to share with others?

If you answered YES to any of these questions, we've got a great event for you! On **Friday, March 1** we're planning a series of Teaching Demos (i.e., demonstrations) to showcase 21st century student-centered teaching methods, and we'd like you to participate.

A Teaching Demo is an interactive, fast-paced session in which instructors from many disciplines share their best assignments, assessment ideas, or class activities. We want to see your best material that other instructors can use in their classes right away. Each demonstration lasts 15 minutes, and each speaker will present the demonstration one or two times.

Instructors in all disciplines are welcome to participate by submitting a simple proposal. Deadline for proposals is **noon on Monday, February 11**. We'll choose the best variety for presentation and let everyone know the results the following week. The demonstrations will take place **from 2 to 3:30 p.m. on Friday, March 1** at the Beren Petroleum Center in G190 Slawson Hall.

How do I submit a proposal and what information should I include?

Creating a proposal is easy. Just fill out the [online form](#), which asks for this information:

- Your name, department, email address and phone number.
- Title of your presentation.
- Brief description (2-3 sentences) of the activity or assignment you will explain.
- Level of class. Is this for an introductory class or an advanced class? Undergraduate or graduate level? Large class or small class?
- Materials needed for your demo (mini-whiteboards and markers, small or large PostIts).

We encourage speakers to provide handouts to help others use the activity. If you would like CTE to make copies, send the original to cte@ku.edu by February 26.
